# GETTING AROUND

BUS CONNECTIONS / MAINLINE RAILWAY / CROYDON'S TRAMLINK / CENTRAL LOCATION



## BUS

Both West Croydon and East Croydon are hubs for bus connections that spiral outwards north towards London, as well as south, east and west. The main bus station, however, is at West Croydon. Destinations include places as diverse as Heathrow, Crystal Palace, Godstone and Tooting.

## TRAMLINK

Croydon's Tramlink offers three routes which join the town centre with Wimbledon, Elmers End, Beckenham and New Addington. Journey times are quick and services are regular. Passengers can use Oyster cards and travelcards plus there is a Tramlink shop in George Street for those who need travel advice and/or tickets.

## RAIL

Croydon is served by the rail network with direct services to many major towns and cities across the UK. Croydon has 17 mainline rail stations, the busiest of which is East Croydon, where up to 70,000 people a day travel on frequent fast trains direct to London (Victoria, London Bridge, Blackfriars and Kings Cross Thameslink), Gatwick and Luton Airports, and the South Coast.

## CYCLE

Approximately 45 miles of cycle routes have been implemented in the Borough since the inception of the London and National Cycle Networks. Cycling is an efficient, cheap, quiet, healthy and non-polluting sustainable form of transport and Croydon Council has been installing a number of road-traffic features to assist safe cycling around the borough including toucan signals, advanced cycle stop lines and contra flow cycle lanes.

There are 420 cycle parking stands for public use at various locations around the borough including shopping parades, district centres, civic buildings, transport interchanges and other areas of public interest.

## ROAD

Croydon is a focal point on the main routes between central London and the south coast with access via the A23 London to Brighton road to the M23 and M25 motorways. The A232 provides east-west links with Kingston, Sutton and Bromley.

## PARKING

Croydon offers 6,500 off-street car parking spaces in the town centre. Directions are provided to the main car parks together with up-to-date information on the availability of spaces. All of the multi-storey car parks are operated with automatic barrier and payment systems while the open-air car parks are pay and display.

Disabled parking is free to Blue Badge holders in all on and off-street pay and display parking places. Poplar Walk car park offers free car parking for the exclusive use of disabled drivers and is conveniently located for Croydon's shopping malls.

## COACH

There is a location for setting down coach passengers outside the Whitgift car park in Wellesley Road.

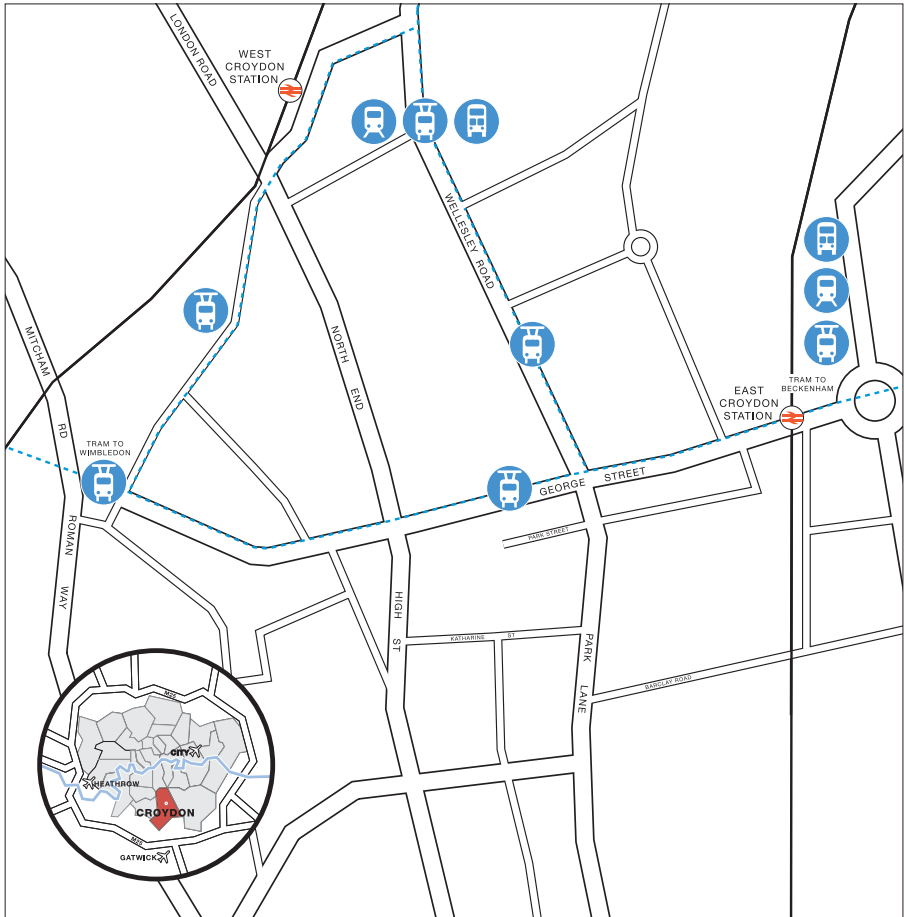
## TRAVEL INFORMATION

Children under 16 travel for free on London's buses and trams, however, children aged 14 and 15 must carry an Oyster photocard. Children under 11 can travel for free during off-peak hours

on the London's Tube and DLR when travelling with an adult who has a valid ticket. Children aged 11-13 must also have an Oyster photocard to travel on the tram from Wimbledon.

CENTRAL LIBRARY / CLOCKTOWER CAFÉ AND GALLERY / DAVID LEAN CINEMA / ART AND CULTURE

If you are new to Croydon, or even a resident of many years, the Croydon Clocktower is a great place to find out more about the town. Whether you want to find information about a day out, get involved in family events, or maybe just get your bearings – the Clocktower

can provide you with all the information you need.

The Clocktower includes Croydon's central library, tourist information centre, café and gallery, plus exhibition space and a small cinema - it's a great place to get started.

## CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Central Library in Croydon offers three floors of resources including books, music, films and computing equipment...

The library also holds a whole host of events for families and young people throughout the year. Children can make films, explore history in workshops and go on book trails during the summer.

## CLOCKTOWER CAFÉ AND GALLERY

The Clocktower's light and airy café is the perfect place to meet friends, grab a morning coffee, a delicious lunch or afternoon tea. Thursday lunchtimes offer free live jazz from 12.15-2.15pm and there is also a varied programme of exhibitions by local artists.

The café is open Monday to Saturday 9.30am-5.30pm and offers a vast selection of hot and cold snacks, Costa Coffee and speciality teas as well as a kids' menu. The café offers an extensive selection of Fairtrade goods.

## DAVID LEAN CINEMA

The David Lean Cinema shows mainstream releases along with specialist films. Special 'babes in arms' matinees make taking very small children to the cinema easier while film buffs can enjoy special events such as film festivals.

## CROYDON MUSEUM

Lottery funding has seen the new look Croydon Museum open in September 2006 with bigger displays, more events and activities throughout the borough, and direct access to the Local Studies Library and Archives for those undertaking research.

## CROYDON ART COLLECTION

The Croydon Art Collection contains over 2000 paintings, prints and drawings. Depictions of local scenes and landmarks are stored alongside prints by Henry Moore and Bridget Riley and paintings by Bengali poet and writer Rabindranath Tagore.

## SOCIAL HISTORY COLLECTION

This collection includes objects used by Croydon people from Saxon times to the present day. A 1950s bubble car, a 19th century clock from the Greyhound Inn and a Subbuttee set are all included.

## RIESCO COLLECTION OF CHINESE CERAMICS

A stunning collection of Chinese ceramics dating from 2500 BC to the 19th century. High points include amazing Tang dynasty tomb models and beautiful Ming dynasty bowls. The collection was left to the London Borough of Croydon by local businessman Raymond Riesco. The whole collection is on permanent display in the Riesco Gallery at Croydon Clocktower.

## ORAL HISTORY COLLECTION

Around 500 interviews with people who have lived, loved and worked in Croydon. Their voices tell of major events and personal experiences. Do you want to know what life in Croydon was like in the past? Listen to the people who know!

Since the ground-breaking Whitgift Centre was built in the 1960s, Croydon's reputation as a great shopping centre has just kept on growing.

Whether you want to stroll round Centrale or the modern day Whitgift Centre – or maybe pick up fresh produce at Surrey Street Market – there are plenty of places to browse for bargains, meet friends, and spend spend spend!

Croydon's main shopping street, North End, has all the big names from Woolworths to M&S – and you never have to walk too far before you find the next coffee shop to stop and rest those shopping bags.

With transport links at both ends of the High Street – West and East Croydon – visitors can gain easy access to Croydon's shopping centre by public transport from all over South London and the South East.

## CENTRALE

Centrale is Croydon's newest shopping centre combing three malls on two levels and includes big names such as House of Fraser, Debenhams, French Connection and Next. Dining options include The Gallery on the Upper Mall and House of Fraser's 'World of Food' incorporating Yo! Sushi, the World of Food Café and the Steak and Seafood Bar.

## SURREY STREET MARKET

Surrey Street Market is a lively local food market. It is one of the oldest to be found in London and was first set up in the 13th Century. The earliest records of the market go back to 1276 when Archbishop Kilwardy obtained a Royal Charter for a weekly market in Croydon. The market was visited by Prince Charles back in 1994. Open Monday to Saturday visitors will find fruit, vegetables, meat, eggs and various other goods stalls. Church Street runs down its west side with tram access in George Street or further down Church Street. The market is all within walking distance of the main shopping centres and is located just behind Croydon Grants complex.



## VISITING MARKETS

New Addington has a Farmers' Market every third Saturday of the month on Central Parade from 10.00am – 2.00pm. Croydon is host to several visiting markets each year including French, Italian and a World and Fair Trade Market. There is also a Croydon Food Festival in August.

## PURLEY WAY AND VALLEY PARK LEISURE COMPLEX

Linked to Croydon by tram, bus and road is the Purley Way and Valley Park Leisure Complex on the A23. The region is easily identified by the IKEA towers that found new life as the Croydon store's landmark following the demolition of the power station that housed them in 1991. B&Q Warehouse, Sainsbury's, PC World, Laura Ashley, Wing Yip, DFS, Jessops and many more names can be found along the Purley Way. Shops are generally open later on the Purley Way than in town with closing times varying between 8.00-10.00pm (check with individual outlets for details). Valley Park (next to IKEA) and The Colonnades (near Croydon Airport Hotel) offer restaurants and entertainment options including a Vue Cinema complex and ten pin bowling alley at Valley Park and City Limits Nightclub at The Colonnades.

Head South – Croydon’s nightlife is centred on the High Street-end of Croydon. Big name clubs and bars such as Tiger Tiger, Edwards and Yates are all within walking distance of each other. Walk further down into South Croydon and the Brighton Road is lined with bars and restaurants including Smollensky’s, Bagattis and The Kyber.

## FAIRFIELD HALLS

Fairfield Halls is one of South London’s premier venues for the arts, entertainment and conferences. The Ashcroft Theatre and Conference Hall have played host to musicals, the International Orchestra Series, children’s shows, comedians, big name musical acts and TV shows such as the BBC’s Question Time. The Green Room Restaurant provides light meals. There is also a licensed bar and Sun Lounge coffee area, and coffee shop.

Fairfield is also a registered charity – receiving no revenue subsidy from any public body – and exists to offer first-class live entertainment and as a venue for local community events.

## SPORTS FACILITIES

Croydon Sports Arena

Facilities including an eight lane 400m running track, with centre field and training area for throwing events. The stadium is floodlit, ideal for training at any time of year. During the winter the inner field becomes a football pitch, home to Croydon Football Club. In the summer the stadium is mostly used for athletic events, hosting several large meetings such as the Surrey Athletic Championships and the occasional international event. The arena is used for special events as well as serious sports and training.

Crystal Palace National Sports Centre  
Multiple facilities for indoor and outdoor, wet and dry sports. Stadium seating capacity 16,500 and up to 45,000 for concerts and similar events. Event management is a speciality.

## CRYSTAL PALACE FC

The club celebrated its centenary in 2005, having formed at the venue of the Glass Palace that stood at the top of Sydenham Hill back in 1905. The Eagles' home, Selhurst Park, was officially opened with just one stand in August 1924 with a match against Sheffield Wednesday. More than 80 years later and the ground offers four stands, conference facilities (suites, dining rooms and executive boxes), a club shop and box office.



The club, currently in the Coca Cola Championship, trains in Beckenham and these grounds are also home to the Crystal Palace FC Youth Academy. Here, players of the future of all ages have all the facilities they require to enjoy and practise their sport. The Academy aims to create a safe and challenging learning environment that allows young players to develop and maximise their potential.

Crystal Palace Ladies FC was formed in the 1993/4 season to provide competitive football for local females of all ages. The club has since enjoyed many league and cup successes with two successive promotions in the past three seasons – establishing the team as one of the fastest growing and most successful ladies clubs in the country. The team is currently in the Premier League Southern Division.

Crystal Palace FC's Study Support Centre is an after school learning facility that offers programmes in which young people from local schools can participate in on a voluntary basis. The centre is part of the government's 'Playing for Success'

initiative where football and other professional sporting clubs are assisting with young people's education.

London Community Cricket Association

For over twenty years the LCCA have used the sport of cricket to help develop individuals, groups and communities. Sport can give individuals pride and self confidence and help them develop respect for themselves and for others. Sport gives young people a positive purpose and leads them towards healthy life choices in a world of potentially negative influences.

It can bring groups together who may have been in conflict and help them to develop a shared understanding and new friendships. Sport can give whole communities a reason to look forward



instead of back and work together for a positive future.

The LCCA thinks cricket is the ideal sport to tackle these social issues because its rules and ethos help to engender respect and good manners towards the opposition and the officials. It teaches young players in particular that dedication will bring its rewards and those rewards are a lifetime of friendships and enjoyment.

The LCCA's 'Opportunities Through Cricket' programmes work in the following three areas:

- **Disability** – this includes; the Special Needs Schools Programme, the Youth Blind Cricket Programme, the England Blind Cricket Team, the Summer Holiday Cricket Camps and the new county disability youth competitions.
- **Urban** – this includes; the Housing Estates Programme, the Urban Coaches Programme, the Inner City World Cup and Tapeball Cricket.
- **Overseas** – this new area of work will use cricket to bring people together

after a period of hostility, promote disability awareness and promote HIV/Aids awareness. The LCCA Cricket Centre is located in Wallington on the borders of Croydon and Sutton.
