Crawley town information

Historical significance

Crawley was an important centre for ironworking in Roman times. Its superb location midway between London and Brighton was recognised in the 18th century when the town prospered as a coaching halt for the fashionable travelling between the city and the coast.

In 1930 an airfield was opened alongside the site of what was Gatwick Racecourse. Gatwick later went on to become the world's busiest two-terminal, single runway airport and is one of Crawley's great strengths.

Some significant and big companies were attracted to the area during the 1960s and large firms still account for a high proportion of employment today.

The town centre and shopping

Crawley's town centre offers a great combination of shopping, relaxation and entertainment. It is a regional shopping destination attracting people from across the county and beyond. Visitors can enjoy an extensive variety from an indoor shopping experience at the popular County Mall, a bustling Queens Square, to refreshments in the historic High Street, relaxing in the award-winning Memorial Gardens or weekly markets.

It's also an active location for our annual event programme including outdoor film screenings, cultural, family and seasonal events.

Crawley Borough Council and West Sussex County Council are investing £3 million to improve Queens Square. We aim to ensure the vitality and viability of the town centre is enhanced.

The town centre has recently attracted new investors from the leisure and finance sectors that include RBS, Lombard, Morrisons, Travelodge, Ed's Diner, Turtle Bay and Pret A Manger.

It's an important centre for retail, hotels and other related businesses and there has been a significant rise in the number of business support-related companies over the years (e.g. finance, legal and IT), driving up the level of employment in Crawley within this sector.

Crawley is a significant contributor and driving force for the local and wider economy. Its economic productivity, provision of commercial floorspace and premises, as well as providing good quality of life and affordability, makes it a very competitive commercial choice for any business.

Sport and leisure

More than 40 sports and activities are available at K2 Crawley leisure centre; a £37 million state-of-the-art facility that was used by Olympic and Paralympic squads as their training camp ahead of the London 2012 Olympic Games.

Located on the edge of the town centre, Crawley Leisure Park attracts people from across the region to its 15-screen cinema including an IMAX screen, health club, bowling alley and several restaurants as well as offering free parking.


















Crawley is surrounded by a number of good golf clubs. Tilgate Forest Golf Centre, set in the magnificent Tilgate Park, is one of the best public Pay & Play courses in the south.

Tilgate Park is also home to Go Ape, the UK's number one forest adventure.

Arts and culture

The Hawth Theatre has one of the liveliest and most diverse programmes in the south east. With a wide range of performance spaces, it offers a huge variety of entertainment from West End shows to comedy nights and outdoor festivals.

Also in the town centre is the £15 million modern library and cultural centre. A new, multi-million pound museum is being built in the historic High Street, with the help of a grant by the Heritage Lottery Fund.

Work is expected to start in spring 2015.

The new museum will provide lots of exciting opportunities for volunteers and businesses to get involved.

Parks and open spaces

Crawley has a number of fantastic parks and open spaces, many of which have been awarded the prestigious Green Flag status. The Memorial Gardens in the heart of the town centre and Goffs Park to the west provide ideal spots to relax. Tilgate Park is the largest of the parks and an impressive flagship. It's set in 400, historic acres with lawns, lakes with fishing facilities, ornamental gardens, nature centre, a beautiful Walled Garden with a café and craft units.

Discover the hidden treasures of Crawley by walking the Greenways; a series of walks with varying levels of difficulty will reveal a different side of Crawley via Gatwick Nature Reserve, Grattons Park, Worth Way, Old Crawley and the Worthlodge Walk.

Our Let's FACE it! volunteering campaign works with businesses and the community to improve the local environment. Thanks to the achievements of the programmes throughout the town, Crawley has achieved highly successful results in both the South and South East in Bloom and Britain in Bloom awards throughout the years.

Living in Crawley

A wide range of housing to suit all tastes and needs can be found in Crawley and the surrounding area. From modern new starter homes, to family-friendly houses and larger executive homes, offering a vibrant urban and suburban lifestyle to a more relaxed village feeling.

Crawley's housing market is continually expanding and the town is seeing some exciting new developments. New neighbourhoods Kilnwood Vale, providing 2,500 new homes, is almost complete and work is underway at Forge Wood to construct 1,900 homes.

Opportunities to get involved

There are plenty of opportunities for business to get involved in Crawley and support the local community. We have a Crawley Developer and Partner Charter, a Meet the Buyers programme, a local Heroes Welcome scheme and, as an accredited employer, Crawley Borough Council actively promotes the Living Wage.

We have a fantastic Crawley STEMfest programme, especially created to enthuse the next generation of scientists, technologists, engineers and mathematicians and to forge links between industry and education.

Manor Royal - big and well connected

The Manor Royal Business District is one of the largest business areas in the south east and a key economic hub in the region. It provides the employment foundation for Crawley and the wider Gatwick Diamond area.

Covering 539 acres, it offers approximately 8 million square feet of developed commercial floor space and is home to more than 500 businesses providing jobs for 30,000 people.

It lies to the north of the built-up area of Crawley, within five minutes by road from Gatwick Airport, the motorway network (M23) and Crawley town centre. It is well served by rail and within easy reach of the cities of London to the north and Brighton and the coast to the south. Its strategically advantageous position and excellent transport connections have been factors in Manor Royal's continued growth and popularity.

The Manor Royal Business District benefits from being the largest non-retail BID in the UK following the successful BID ballot outcome that was announced in May 2013.

The Manor Royal BID provides the platform for businesses in the area to work together and deliver area-wide improvements and initiatives to benefit their business and staff.

Gatwick Airport



Every year, Gatwick contributes around £2 billion to the South East's economy. We enable businesses to prosper, tourism to flourish, and 21,000 people to say they are proud to work at Gatwick Airport, with over 35% of them living in Crawley.

We invested £1.2 billion between 2008 and 2014 and have committed to invest a further £1 billion going forward. Improvements so far include a new, £31 million South Terminal forecourt, a £45 million state-of-the-art South Terminal security area, a £34 million extension to the South Terminal departure lounge and a £75 million extension to the North Terminal.

We know that the extensive social and economic benefits that Gatwick creates must also be balanced with a sustainable airport operation. From an environmental perspective, we are realising the benefits from our previous £1.2 billion investment programme as we have reduced the amount of electricity consumed despite increasing passenger numbers and aircraft movements. As a result of this capital investment programme and the work we do across the airport with our business partners and third parties, Gatwick Airport has reduced its overall carbon emissions by 28,052 tonnes since 2009 the equivalent of more than 50 fully-laden Airbus A380s and we are aiming to be carbon neutral by 2040.

Also contributing to the environment will soon be a hugely improved rail service for our passengers and the local communities around Gatwick, so that significantly more people will be able to access the airport by train more often, and in much greater comfort. These transformational improvements will see rail capacity double by 2020, and nearly triple by 2035. This will be achieved by new, longer trains and through other infrastructure improvements including a redeveloped station at Gatwick.

On a national scale, Gatwick is on the shortlist of potential locations for the UK's next runway. Our vision of a two runway Gatwick would mean London had two world class airports helping to connect London and the south east to the rest of the world.

Crawley has certainly led the way in terms of activity compared with other regional centres, underpinning its key locational attractions of excellent road transport links, air links through Gatwick Airport, easy rail links to Central London and the South Coast. Couple that with access to an experienced labour market, it is no surprise that Crawley is now the established business capital in Sussex.

Key names that have recently been attracted to the town include Nestlé who moved from Croydon some 18 months ago bringing 800 people with them.

Crawley will shortly be seeing the first major speculative office scheme on Manor Royal providing 110,000 sq ft of much needed top quality Grade A offices scheduled for completion end of 2015. Further evidence of the confidence that developers and investors have in the strength of occupier demand in this exciting area."

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

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
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
